

1 Citation & Abbreviations

The citation should follow the author-year system with *full* bibliographic information in the bibliography (see below).

1.1 Examples for citation styles within the footnotes or the main text

1.2 Examples for full references (citation style sheet)

1.2.1 Monographs

1.2.4 Defining abbreviations in the bibliography

<i>AHW</i>	<i>AHW</i> = Wolfram von Soden. 1965-1981. <i>Akkadisches Handwörterbuch</i> , 3 volumes, Wiesbaden.
<i>Dendara VII</i>	<i>Dendara VII</i> = Emile Chassinat. 1972. <i>Le temple de Dendara VII</i> , Cairo.

NB:

- (1) Abbreviations of frequently cited works (*Edfou II*, EG, Urk. IV) must be defined in the bibliography (compare 1.2.4).
- (2) Common abbreviations of Journals (*JEA*), Series (PÄ), Lexica (LÄ) are not accepted, the same applies to first names.
- (3) Mentioning the publisher after the place (e.g. Oxford: Oxford University Press) is possible (if consistently) but not obligatory.
- (4) The surname precedes the first name only in the initial position of a citation.
- (5) The usage of commas, full points and ampersands should be consistently (see the examples above).

3 Supra references

Supra references (loc. cit., op. cit., idem, ibidem etc.) should be avoided. Cross references to the article's pages are not accepted.

4 Quotation marks

The style of quotation marks should follow the article's language:

English “Text ‘within’ quotation marks”

French « Text ‘within’ quotation marks »

German „Text ,within‘ quotation marks“
